## Funding following hospital discharge from 1st September

The government have announced funding to support 6 weeks of follow-on care after a person is discharged from hospital. The additional support will include domiciliary care, community nursing services or care home costs depending on the needs of the person. This funding will run until the 31st March 2021.

To support this process providers should:

- Identify their capacity to support hospital discharges and liaise with their local adult social care lead
- Ensure that they have sufficient PPE stocks
- Ensure that regular COVID-19 testing is taking place
- Ensure that a care plan assessment is undertaken with each new service user during the initial 6-week period
- Work with multidisciplinary teams to ensure the correct packages of support are in place and equipment is available where required
- Where reablement or rehabilitation services are being provided, these should be monitored, and the effectiveness of that service shared
